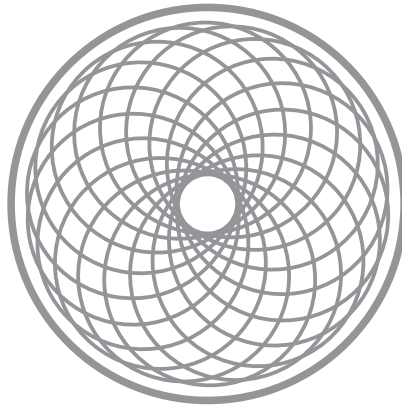


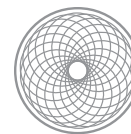

Objective

The principle of Waldorf teachers learning through collaboration is an essential and founding aspect of every Waldorf School.

The collaborative mentoring seminar provides an opportunity for experienced Waldorf teachers to not only deepen their own practice, but also to encourage more active collaboration between colleagues by creating relevant mentoring practices within and between schools in the region.

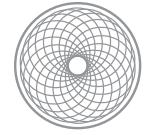
Course Description

The collaborative mentoring seminar began in the summer of 2008 as a renewal course in New Hampshire. Here, we began a discussion on the essentials of Waldorf education versus the dogmas. We also reviewed active mentoring practices. We will continue our work in March 2009 at the regional conference in Vermont, and again July 2009, as a renewal course in New Hampshire. In our summer session, we will discuss the question, how do we develop as teachers to better understand and support the growth of the children in our classrooms today? The seminar will also explore ways of instilling a more conscious understanding of the healing potential of Waldorf education.

Guest Presentations

Barbara and Ron Richardson, who bring experience in Eurythmy and Speech, will offer special presentations.

Rachel Ross, who is a practicing extra lesson teacher and consultant will help us become more careful observers of the children we teach and reflect on how movement can be used to support the healthy development of each child.

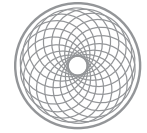
