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## **2005 - 2006 Annual Report to the Association of Waldorf Schools of North America**

**May 2006**

### **Introduction**

The Center for Anthroposophy (CfA) was founded in 1989 as New England Waldorf Teacher Training (NEWTT) with a mission to assist Antioch New England Graduate School in meeting the rapidly growing need for trained Waldorf teachers in North America by co-sponsoring the Waldorf Program at Antioch's Department of Education. In 1996 the NEWTT Council decided to expand upon their initial work and the Center for Anthroposophy was launched. The Center is now focusing on the full cycle of human development through Foundation Studies, teacher education (now spanning from early childhood to high school), career mentorship and professional development programs such as Pedagogical Eurythmy, Collaborative Leadership, and Renewal Courses. Our periodically updated web site now includes changes in faculty, descriptions of new courses, and details of the forthcoming round of "Renewal Courses".

In January 2006, the Center's governing Council agreed to divide its work into two bodies – one a board of trustees and the other an advisory council. This change will take effect sometime in the next year.
